BEHIND THE NUMBERS

5,770 ORCHARDS established

The Activity: GPFA assisted farmers in establishing high value orchard enterprises and provided extension support and business training.

The Impact: New enterprises that increase incomes for farmers and provide sustainable livelihoods.

9,827 STUDENTS supported

The Activity: In one example, GPFA worked with Albironi University to establish a demonstration farm, community outreach program, reservoir, learning pavilion, and technical workshops.

The Impact: Practical field-based training facilities for agriculture students as well as local farmers.

15,589 INDIVIDUALS benefitted

The Activity: GPFA cleaned and repaired above ground water channels and underground karez, or canals, in multiple districts of Wardak Province.

The Impact: Improved water flow for use in agriculture by 25% on average.

1,649 STRAWBERRY GARDENS planted

The Activity: GPFA distributed 250,000 strawberry plants and trained farmers, over 1,000 of whom were women, in planting strawberry plots and processing the produce.

The Impact: The average gross income from one small plot of strawberries is estimated at \$822.
